



## VICTORIA TOURISM BULLETIN

## August 2019

- While 2019 continues to see mixed tourism results across Canada with the lingering effects of a record run up in demand over the past six years, pan-Canadian wide tourism planning meetings held this week confirmed a broad deceleration in demand in travel worldwide that will start to affect all of Canada in the months and year or two ahead. This is particularly evident in long haul leisure and business travel.
- The demise of Thomas Cook may just be the first major international tour operator to fall. Credible reports published from SKIFT report that global player Cox and Kings is in significant trouble.
- In Greater Victoria, we have been preparing for a cyclical downturn for over two years and have built a strong
  book of confirmed meetings and sports tourism business to ride out global cyclical downturns. After a softer start
  to 2019, Q4 will be strong for the Victoria Conference Centre, and will come close to achieving the numbers from
  2018 which was a record. 2020 will be a solid year at the Victoria Conference Centre and sports tourism
  business continues to book including the recent announcement of the NCAA women's basketball tournament in
  November of this year.
- The tourism industry would like to thank Evelyn O'Connor for her 14 years of positive contributions to the Victoria Conference Centre. Evelyn is leaving to spend more time with family at the end of September.
