VICTORIA

In July, we saw very slow rebuilding of business based on close in markets. The Visitor Economy is in for a long rebuild but is determined to continue.

- Thanks to 19 participating hotels a regionally focused Reconnect campaign was launched with an incentive of a \$75 gift card with a two night stay.
- As part of long-term planning to modernize the Royal BC Museum (RBCM) precinct, the RBCM has exercised an option to purchase the IMAX Victoria theatre. The Royal BC Museum has purchased the IMAX Victoria from Destination Cinema Inc. for approximately \$3.8 million, funded through a government grant. The IMAX Victoria theatre has operated within the Museum since June 1998. Each year approximately 356,000 people enjoy movies in the theatre.
- Destination Canada has released the June 2020 tourism snapshot. As expected, total overnight arrivals are down by over 98% year-over-year. <u>Read more.</u>

All international source markets, most business travel, conference, leisure travel, cruise and international tour and travel business has been lost for the foreseeable future. As a result of these extraordinary circumstances year over year comparisons are immaterial.
