"Time-off tax is defined as employees putting in extra hours just before taking vacation. Encouragingly, a recent survey done by ADP Canada is showing that those extra hours are shrinking: An average of 18 hours of additional work was clocked by employees, found the survey.



However, this represented two hours less than the levels of extra work seen in 2020, which points to good news for overworked employees."
